## The Administrator Ordinance 1975

No. 34, 1975
An Ordinance to supplement "An Ordinance to appoint a person for the purposes of the 26 th Section of the Constitutions and the 39th Section of the Church of England Trust Property Act 1917" (Assented to 25 November, 1921).

Whereas by or under "An Ordinance to appoint a person for the purposes of the 26th Section of the Constitutions and the 39th Section of the Church of England Trust Property Act 1917" provision is made for the election of a person for the purposes therein and whereas Rt. Rev. Arthur John Dain has been elected in accordance with the provisions of the said Ordinance NOW the Synod of the Diocese of Sydney HEREBY ORDAINS, DECLARES, DIRECTS AND RULES as follows.

1. That the said Rt. Rev. Arthur John Dain is appointed to be the person by whom under the said circumstances and during the said periods the said powers are to be exercised in pursuance of the said 26th Section of the said Constitutions and as the person by whom the said powers, functions and things are to be exercised, done or made in pursuance of the said 39th Section of the said Church of England Trust Property Act 1917.
2. That notwithstanding the provisions of the Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to appoint a person for the purposes of the 26th Section of the Constitutions and the 39th Section of the Church of England Trust Property Act $191^{\prime \prime}$ in the event of the death, incapacity, absence from the State or unwillingness to act of Rt. Rev. Arthur John Dain the person to act for the purposes set out in Clause 1 of this Ordinance shall be Rt. Rev. John Robert Reid.
3. This Ordinance may be cited is "The Administrator Ordinance 1975".
